A large-scale digital repository of content shared by more than 80 library partners, HathiTrust serves as both a secure and trusted repository of content. with any mp3 device, including ipods.



Getting a NYPL Library Card

New York residents ages 13 and older can get a digital library card through the online card application and gain access to an array of digital resources. If you live, work, go to school or pay taxes in New York State, you are eligible for a NYPL Library Card.

OverDrive:

Browse a large selection of e-books, audiobooks, and video, for use with a wide variety of e-readers, portable devices, PCs, and Macs.

Cloud Library:

Explore a growing selection of e-books, for use with the iPhone, iPad, iPod Touch, Android products, and Windows PCs.

Flipster Digital Magazines:

Get free access to more than 100 popular magazines, including Bon Appetit, Seventeen, Time, and English and Spanish editions of People.

AudioBookCloud:

Listen to audio books in many different categories, including fiction, nonfiction, and classics. These books are always available, never on hold, and do not need to be downloaded.

BARD (Braille & Audio Reading Download):

If you have a visual impairment, physical print disability, or dyslexia, become a member of the Andrew Heiskell Library to get free access to the BARD collection of e-audiobooks, e-audio magazines, and electronic braille.

Bookshare:

If you have a print disability, sign up for Bookshare, a service where books are read aloud by the synthetic voice of your computer or mobile device, while also displaying highlighted text.

TumbleBooks:

Enjoy animated talking picture books, story books, puzzles, and games, or find audiobooks and books in other languages.

TumbleBook Cloud:

Explore videos and chapter books in categories that include e-books, read alongs, graphic novels, and audiobooks suitable for middle and high school grades.

TumbleBook Cloud Jr:

Browse our collection of videos and chapter books that include read-alongs, graphic novels, and audio books suitable for elementary grades.

Bookflix:

Find classic fictional video storybooks from Weston Woods, as well as nonfiction e-books from Scholastic, suitable for PreK–3rd grade. E-Books from Scholarly Presses
